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Clinical waste	
Permitted items	Clinical waste is defined in the Controlled Waste Regulations 1992. It refers to any waste that contains: - Human or animal tissue - Blood or bodily fluids - Excretions - Drugs or other pharmaceutical products - Swabs or dressings
	 Syringes, needles or other sharp instruments which, unless rendered safe, may prove hazardous to any person coming into contact with it.

Hygiene and offensive waste	
Permitted items	 Non-clinical waste that's non-infectious and doesn't contain pharmaceutical or chemical substances, but may be unpleasant to anyone who comes into contact with it Human and animal waste (faeces) Incontinence pads, sanitary waste Catheter and stoma bags Nappies Nasal secretions Sputum Condoms Urine Vomit and soiled human bedding from a non-infectious source Medical/veterinary items of disposable equipment such as gowns etc Plasters (minor first aid or self-care) generated by personal use Animal hygiene waste – e.g. animal bedding Waste from non-healthcare activities – e.g. waste from body piercing or application of tattoos (excluding sharps)
